



Civil War – Union Occupation - Chatham

Chatham was built in 1771 and was the only house in America to be visited by George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and Abraham Lincoln.

Chatham is best-known for its role in the Civil War when it served the Union Army as both a headquarters and hospital. Clara Barton, Dr. Mary Walker, and Walt Whitman were at the house during the war.

Chatham is the current National Park Service headquarters for the Fredericksburg/Spotsylvania National Military Park.
